Chief's Report

Follow-up Information

- Two candidates completed their pre-employment screening and will begin pre-academy on August 15th.
- Burn ban went into effect July 1st and will remain in effect until at least October 1st.
- Chief Fehr will be absent from the August Fire Commissioners meeting and Deputy Chief Hayman will be handling the Chief's duties.
- Enumclaw Firefighters will be staffing a booth at the Enumclaw Street Fair.

Washington Survey and Rating Bureau (WSRB) Community Evaluation

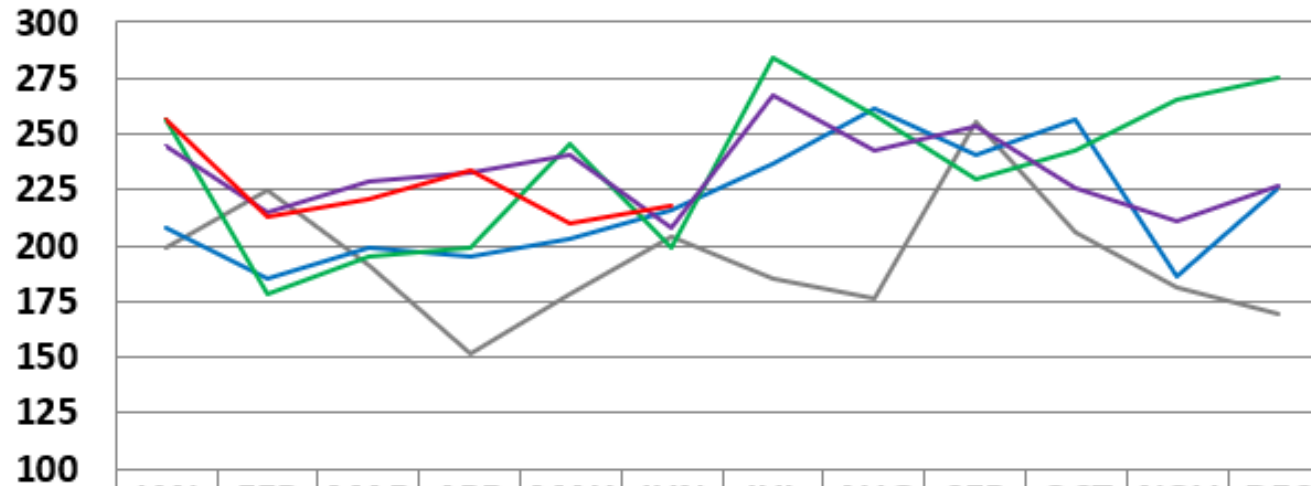
- The WSRB is a non-profit public service organization authorized by legislation and the Washington State Insurance Commissioner to perform community evaluations.
- The WSRB evaluation looks at data for multiple risk factors to establish an overall rating on which consumer insurance rates are based.
- The community risk factors are weighted as follows:
 - Fire Department Operations 40%
 - Water Supply 35%
 - Fire Safety and Control 16%
 - Emergency Communications 9%
- The rating scale is 1 through 10 and generally communities with a lower rating pay less for homeowner insurance premiums.

Washington Survey and Rating Bureau Community Evaluation (Continued)

- Our community ratings for our Fire District is broken down into two separate areas: The City/Urban Growth Area (UGA) and Unincorporated King County.
- The City/UGA received a protection class rating of 4 and a 5 in Unincorporated areas.
- This is unchanged from our previous evaluation.
- To put this in perspective only 27% of all Washington State communities received a protection class rating of 4 or better and 47% scored a protection class 5 or better.
- Areas where the Enumclaw Fire Department did not have deficiencies were our Fire Marshal, Fleet Maintenance, and the Fire Academy.
- We will retain our Tender Credit.
- We also scored well in Training however it was weighted on a five-year average, and we did not receive full credit for all five years as there were many recent improvements.
- Areas where the Enumclaw Fire Department can improve is our fire station distribution and staffing levels.

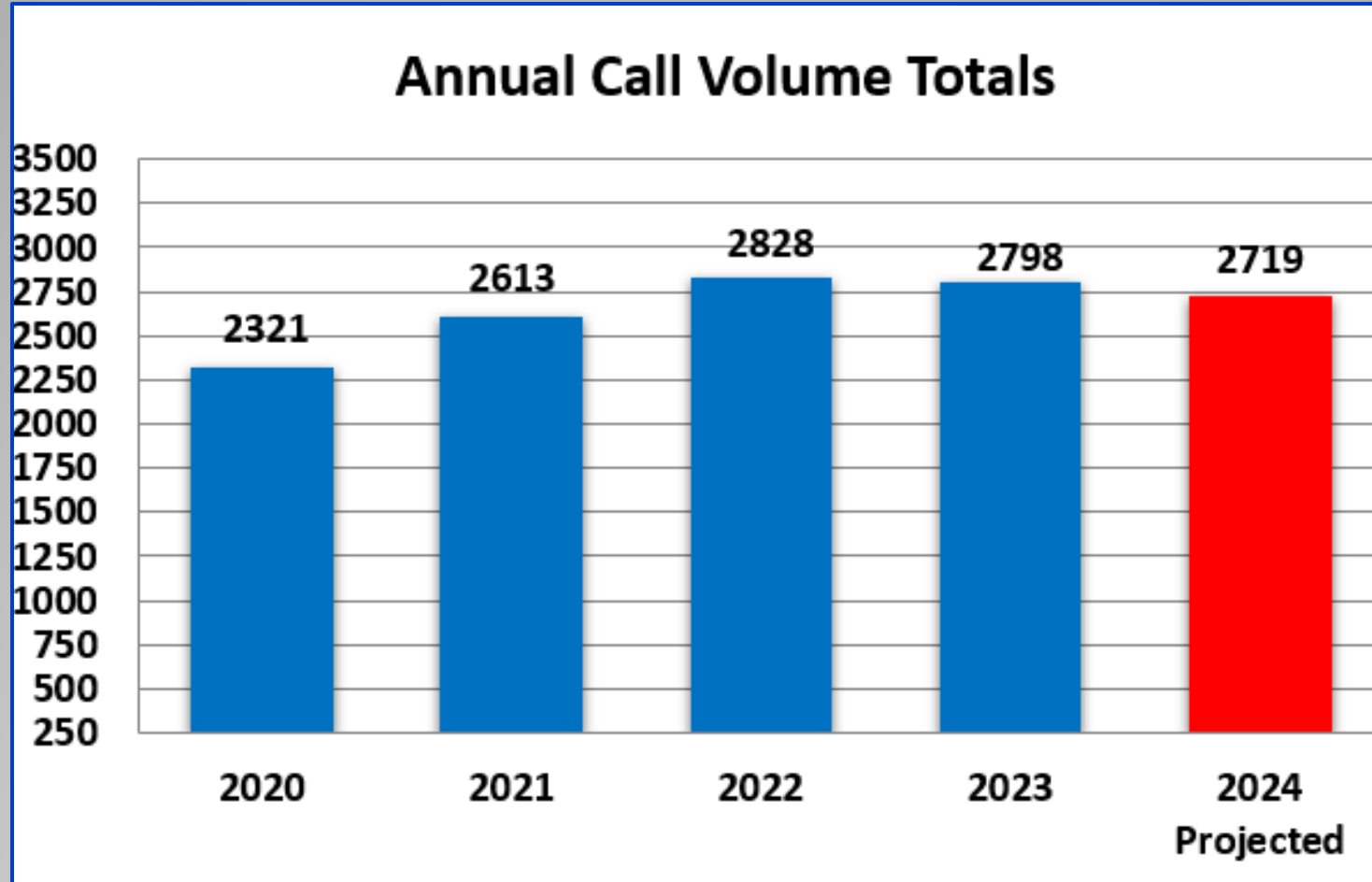
Call Volume

Monthly Call Volume Comparison



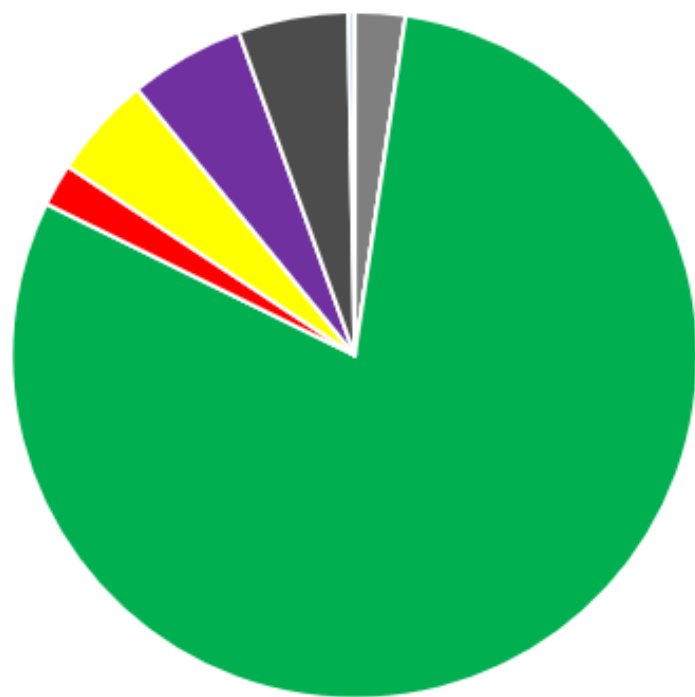

Call Volume Comparison



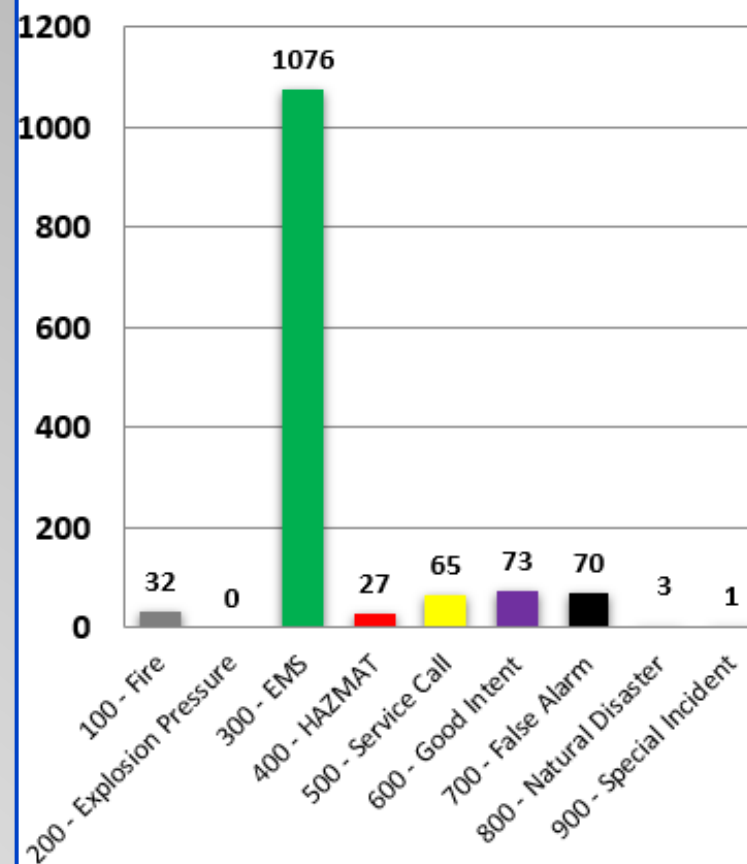

YTD Incident Types



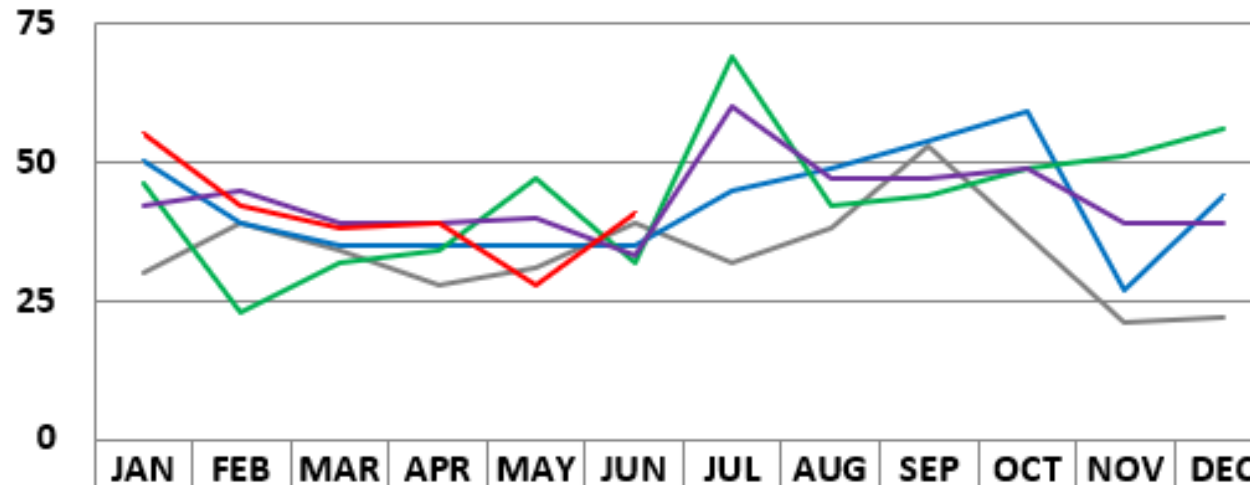
- 100 - Fire 2.4%

Monthly Concurrent Calls Comparison



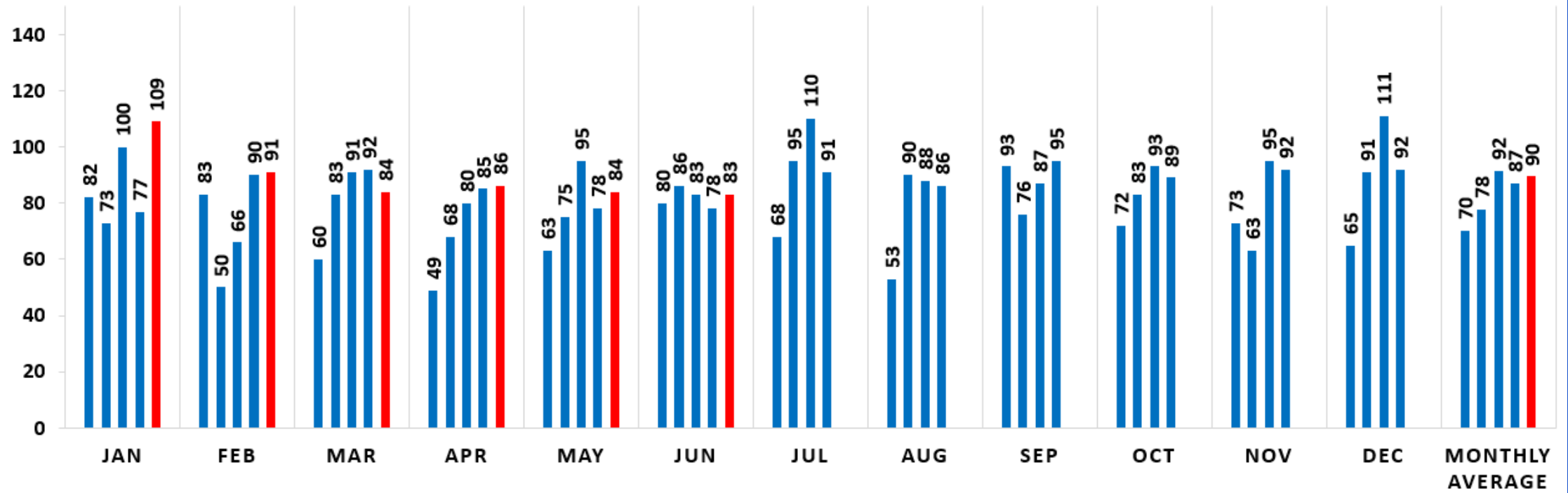
Concurrent Call Average
