Follow up/Information

- Two firefighter candidates for the August Fire Academy are almost done with the pre-employment process
- EFD newsletter mailed out to the community and quarterly Chief's column in the Courier-Herald
- Meetings with local long-term care facilities have begun, more are scheduled for August
- Working on the 2024 EFD Budget
- Work has begun on staffing analysis-data gathering
- A recent Fire Academy graduate will be starting on shift next week
- KC Fair was staffed each day with EFD personnel
- Street Fair will be staffed by EFD personnel on 7/21 and 7/22
- National Night Out is scheduled for 8/1



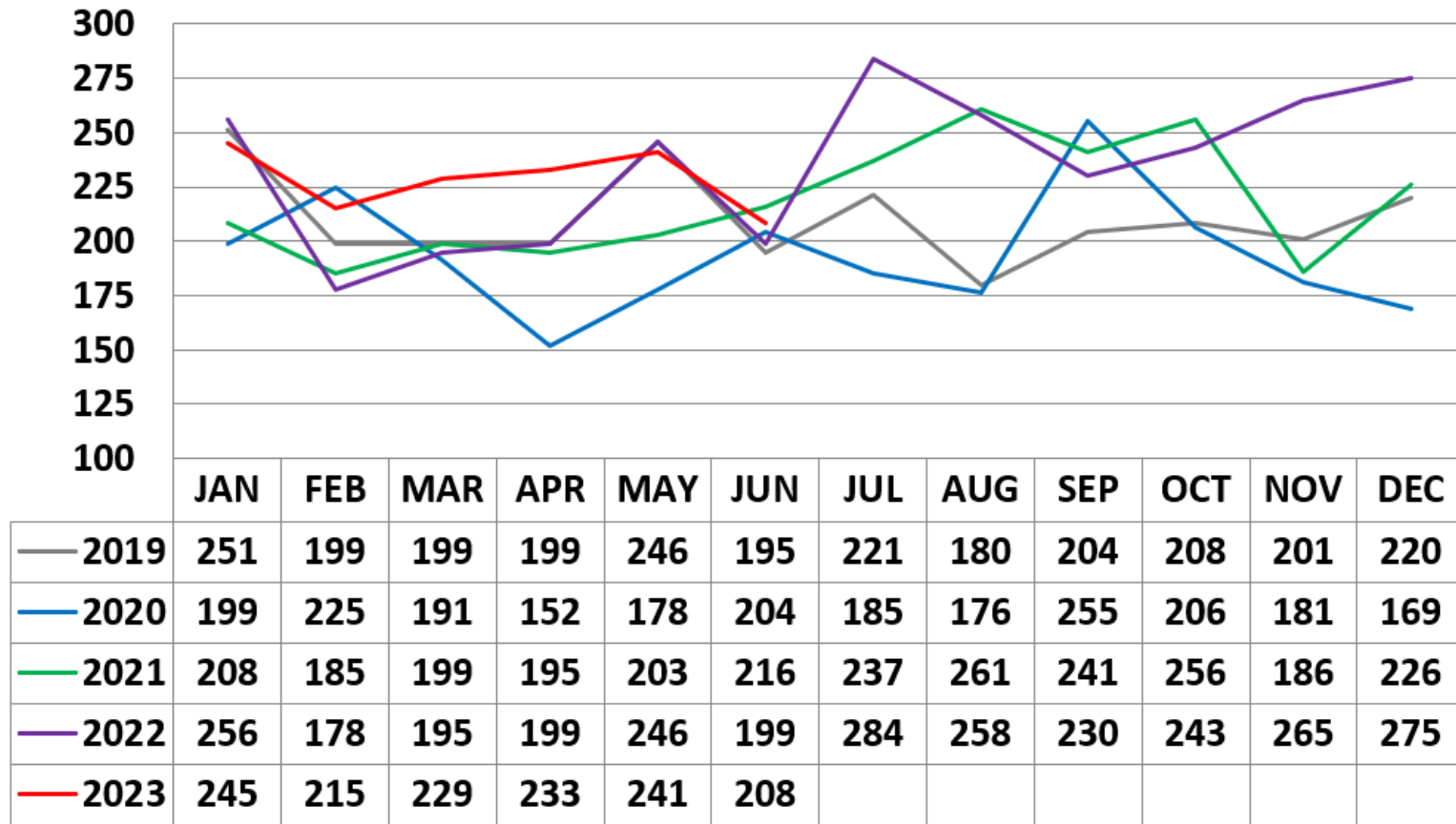
July 4th

- District was upstaffed with a total of 6 personnel
- 18 calls for service (Normal daily average is 7.75)
- Two structure fires, two brush fires in our fire district (Fireworks caused incidents)
- Dispatched two three additional structure fires via automatic aid
- Total calls for service **increased by 166% compared to 2022 and 200% compared to 2021**
(both holidays on weekday)
- Fire incidents in District increased by 400%
- Zero fireworks-related injuries
- Zone 3 Data compared to 2022- **123% in total volume, 955% in brush fires, 600% in structure fires**



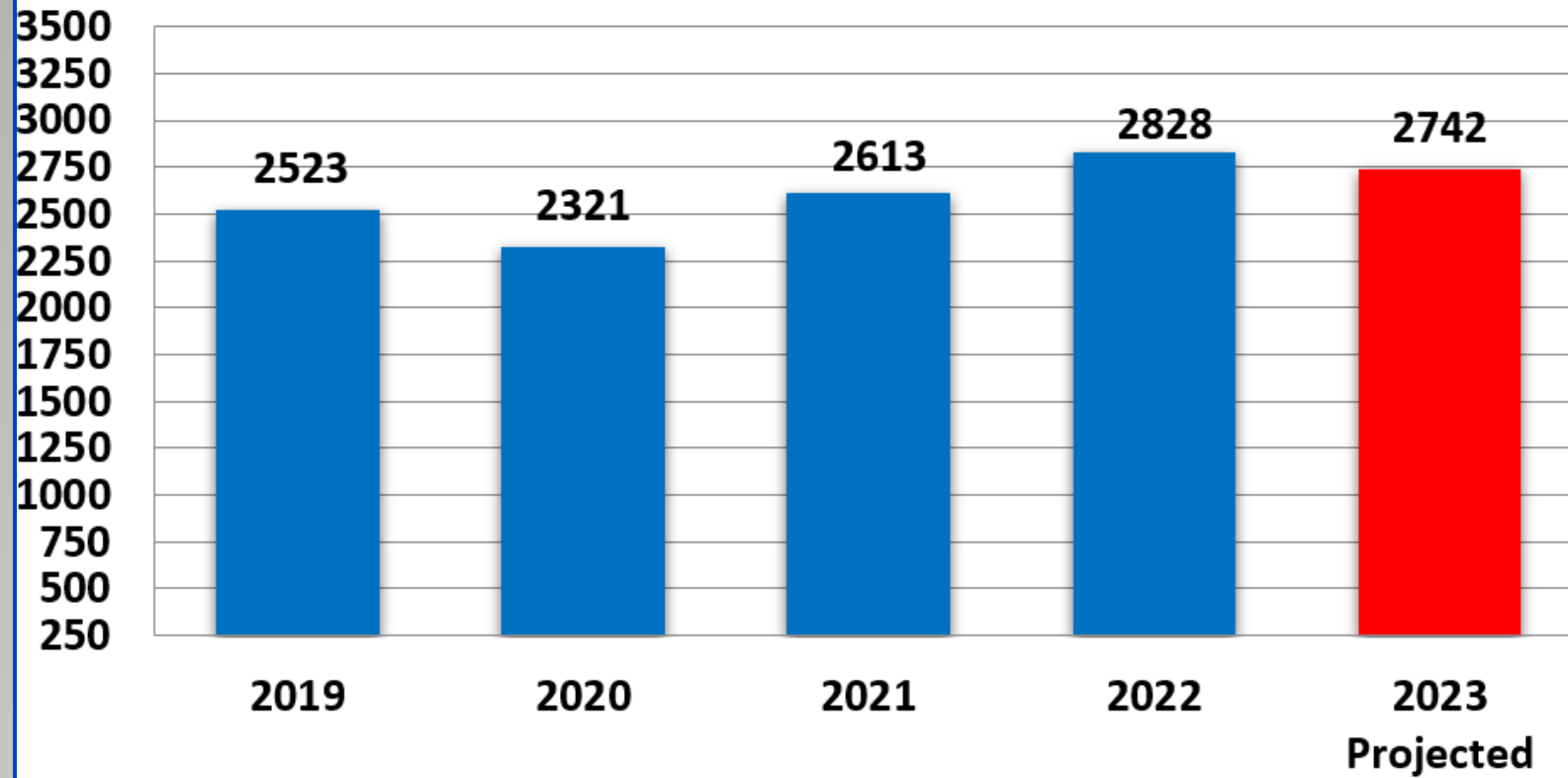
Call Volume

Monthly Call Volume Comparison



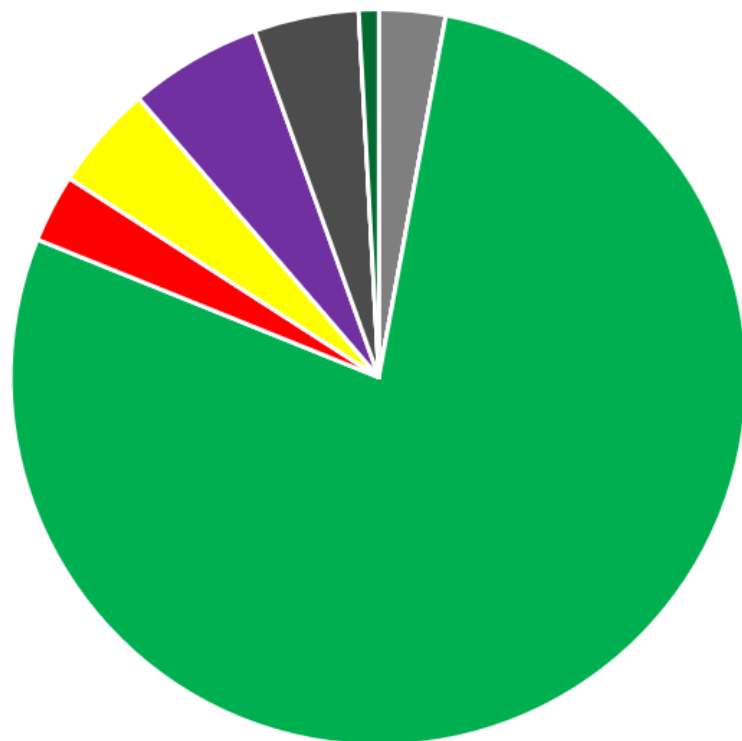
Call Volume Comparison

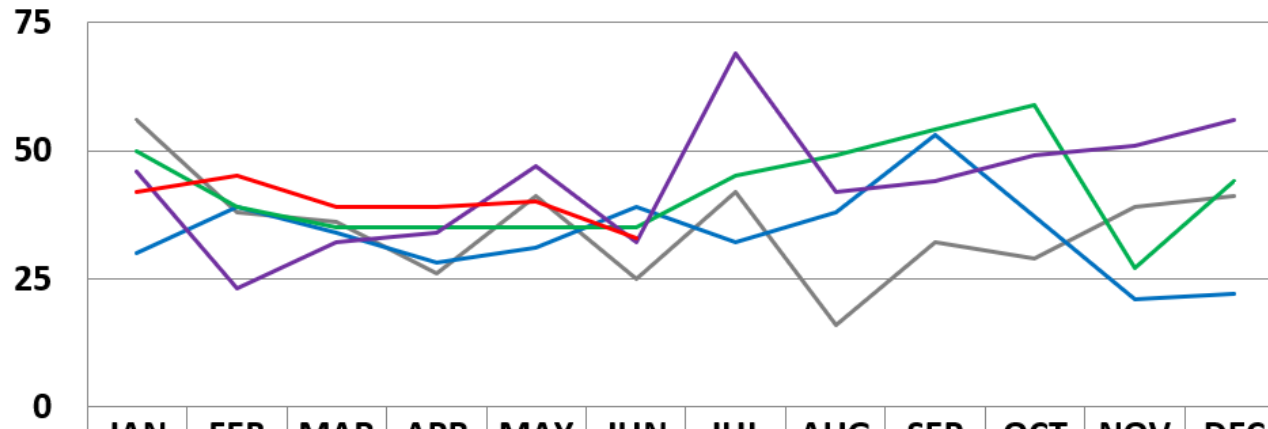
YTD Incident Types

Monthly Concurrent Calls Comparison

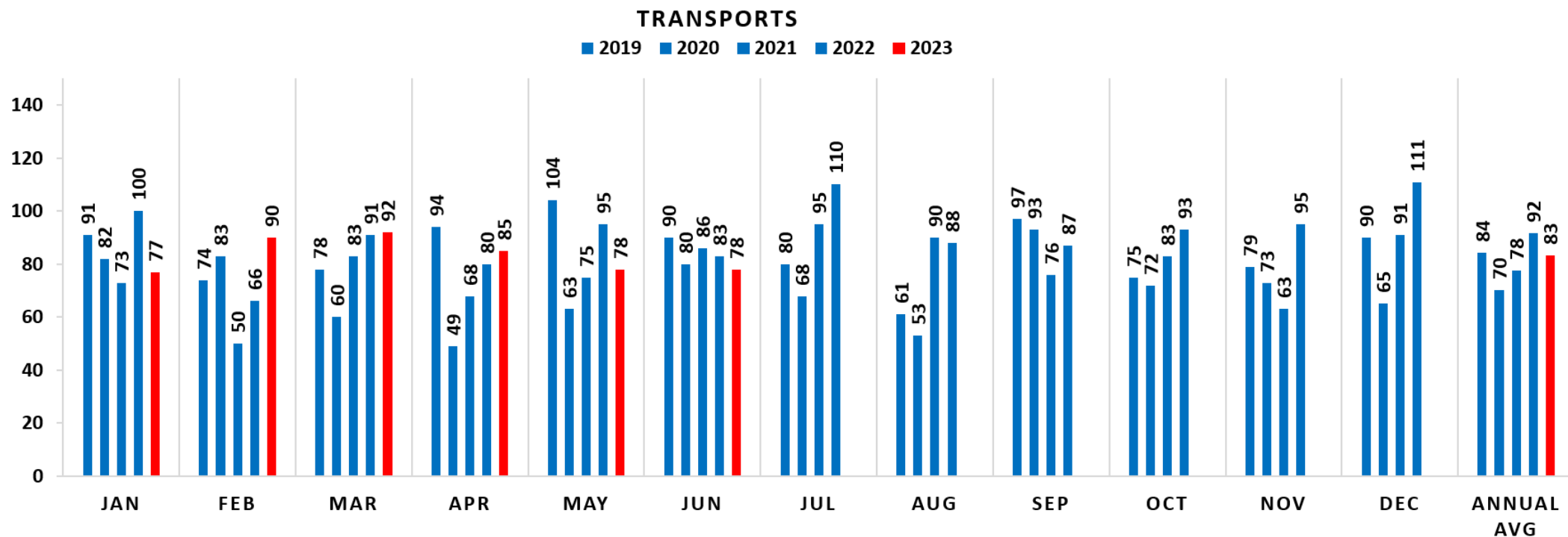


Concurrent call Average

Transports



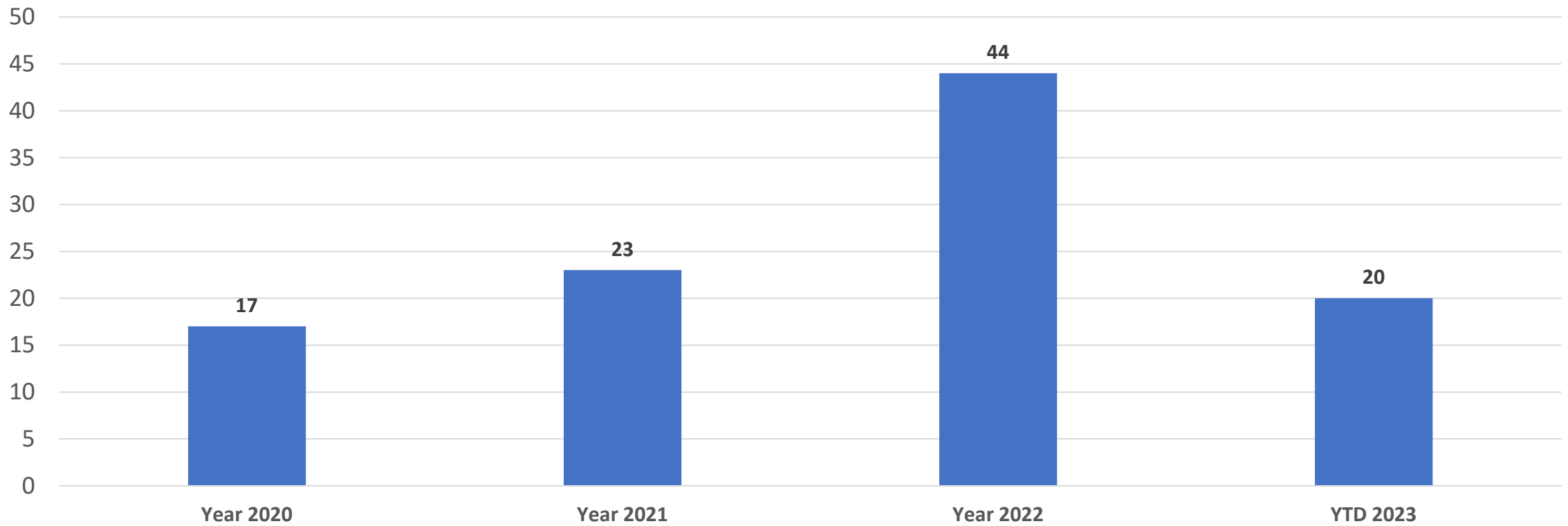
Transport Yearly Totals

I want to acknowledge firefighter-EMTs: Tony Stewart, Joe Dines, Jamie Steinbacher, Mitchell Oake and John Bloomer of Enumclaw Fire Department for their care of [REDACTED] who suffered a cardiac arrest the midafternoon of [REDACTED] 2023. As you recall, [REDACTED] was found unconscious and unresponsive on the bedroom floor by her son. The BLS crew performed CPR and with the assistance of King County M-12 paramedics were able to successfully resuscitate and transport her to MultiCare Auburn Medical Center. I am pleased to report that she was discharged to a skilled nursing facility awake and alert, and with an opportunity to again enjoy life.

I appreciate your crew's dedication to providing lifesaving care. I recognize that we are constantly working to deliver best care while also evaluating promising approaches or technologies to push cardiac arrest survival even higher here in King County.
