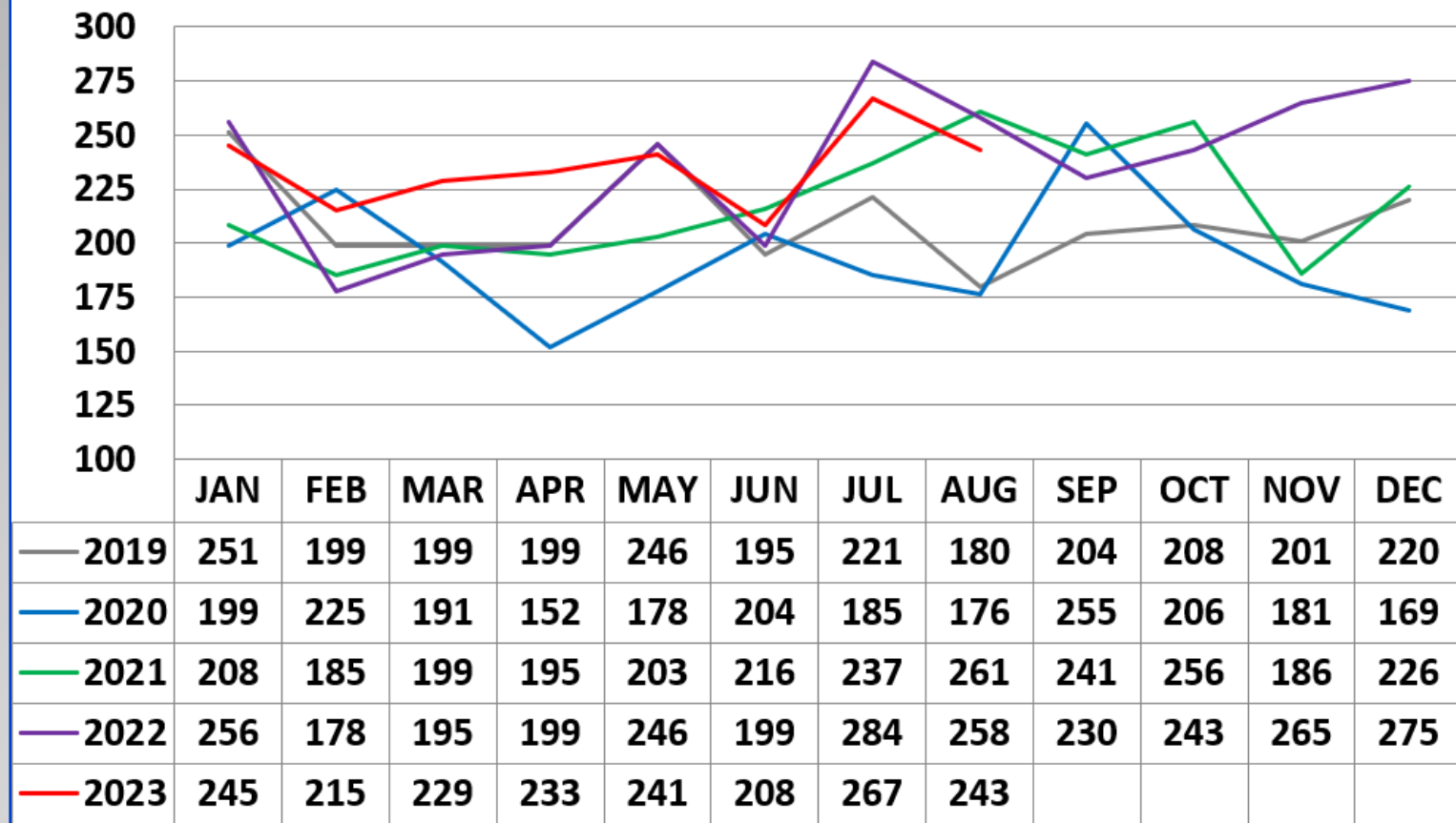
Follow up/Information

- One of the two firefighter candidates that were given conditional offers, withdrew from the process before the start of the fire academy. They accepted a job offer from another fire agency.
- The other firefighter candidate has successfully completed the pre-employment process and is currently in the SKCFTC Fire Academy.
- WSRB evaluation occurred on 9/4 (approximately 45 days to get the results).
- Work on the staffing analysis was paused during the WSRB evaluation and will now resume.
- Meetings with our local long-term care facilities have occurred and planning for group meetings this fall.
- Continuing to work on the 2024 EFD Budget.
- Working on updates to our apparatus replacement schedule.
- Started the Fire Apparatus spec and design process.

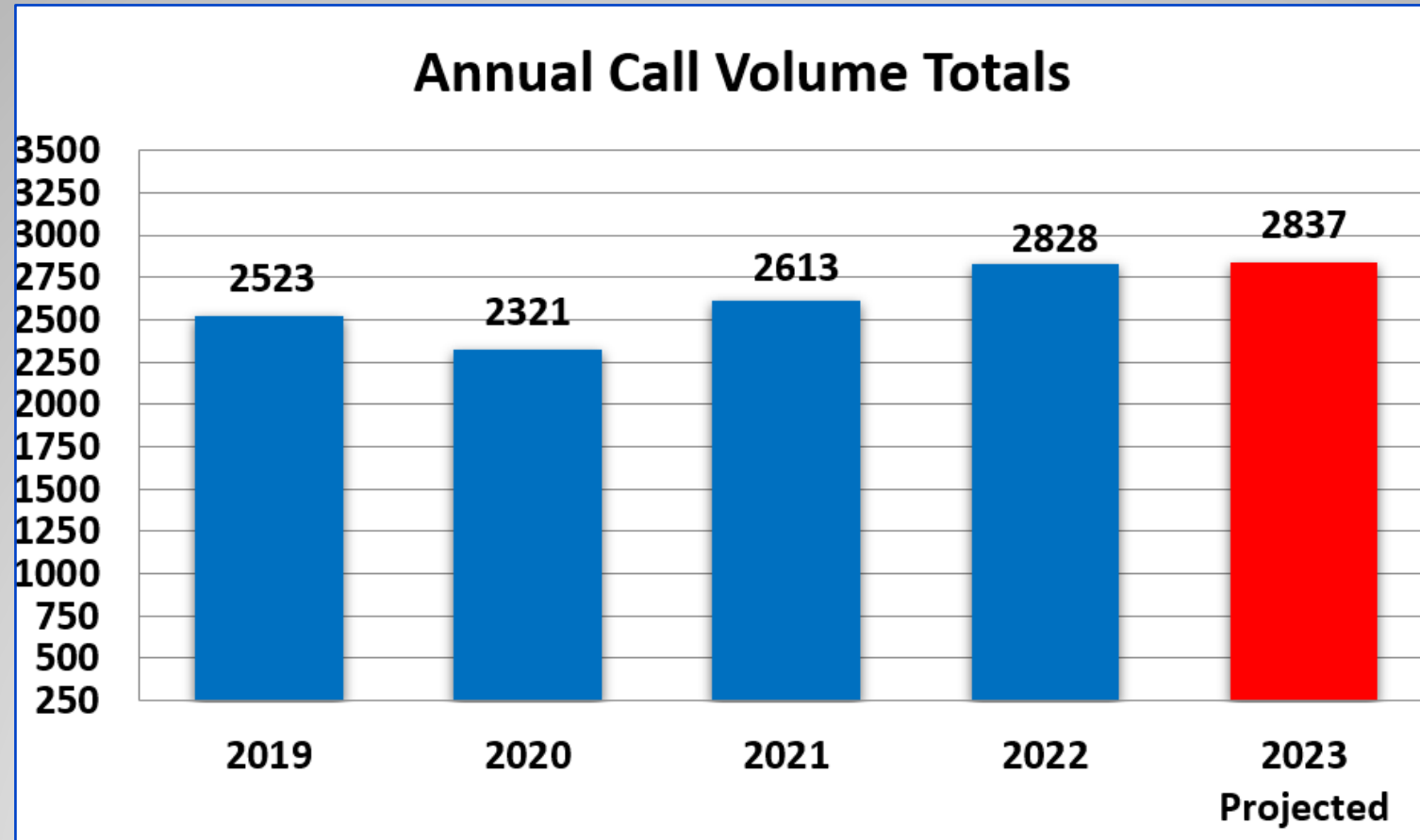


Call Volume

Monthly Call Volume Comparison

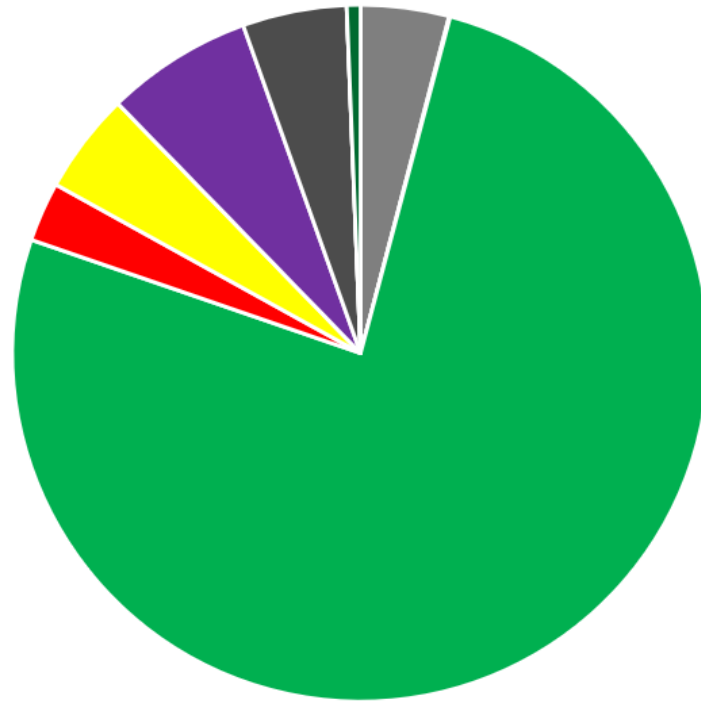

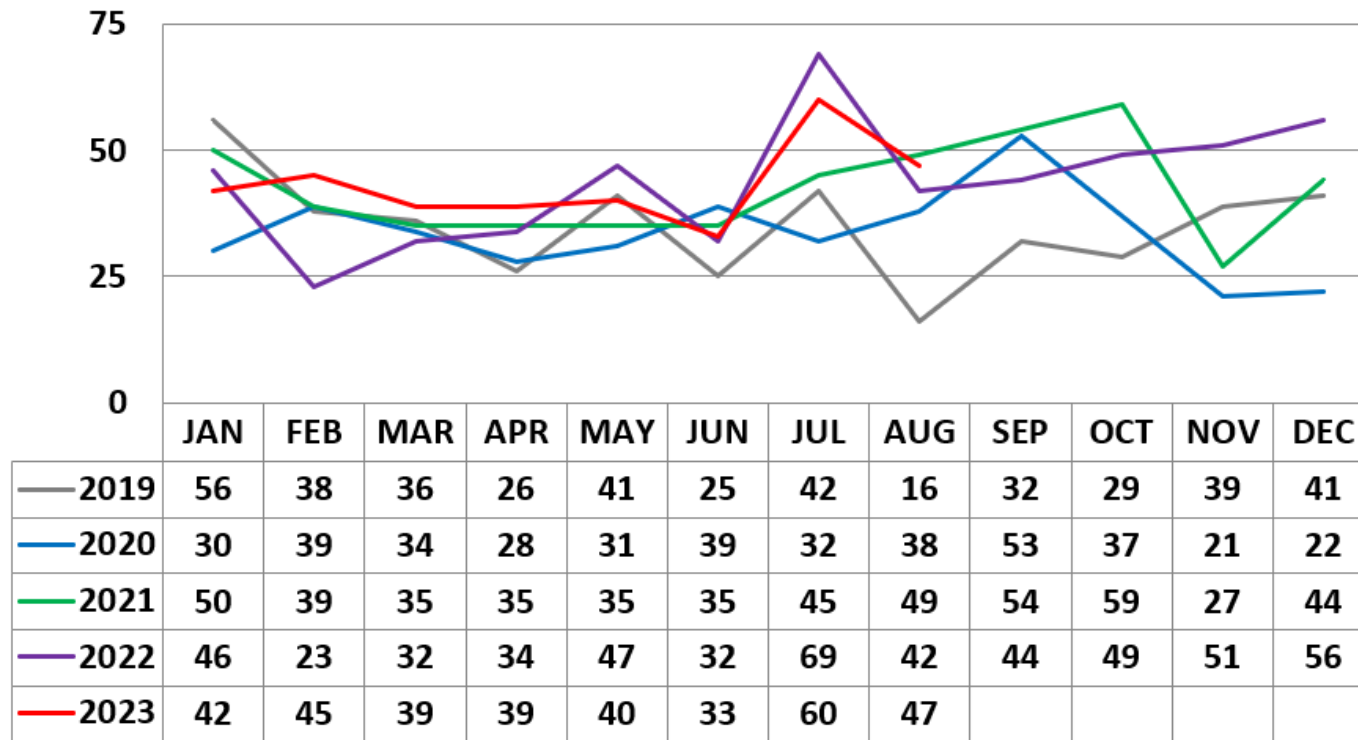
YTD Incident Types

Call Volume Comparison

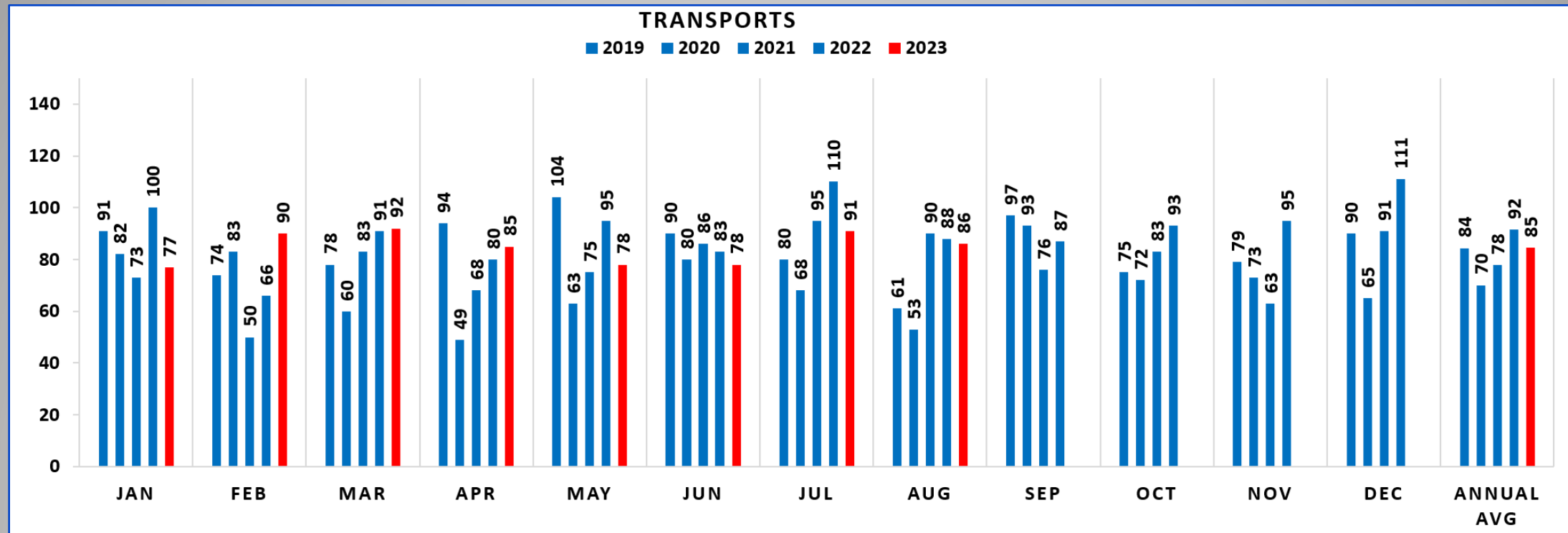
Monthly Concurrent Calls Comparison

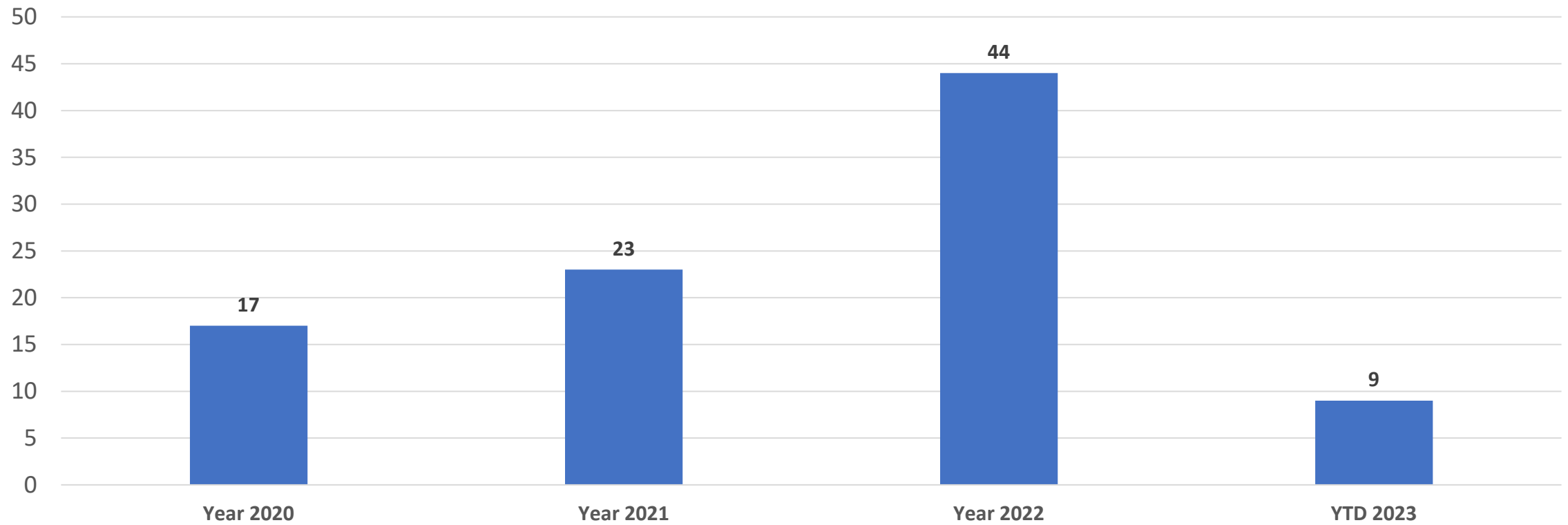

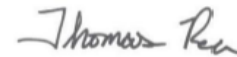

I want to acknowledge firefighter-EMTs: Casey Smith, Chandler Jensen, Kurtis Poston, Lance Hardersen, Shane Muncaster and Joe Brassard of Enumclaw Fire Department for their care of [REDACTED] who suffered a cardiac arrest the early afternoon of March 18, 2023. As you recall, [REDACTED] had a painful headache followed by a seizure. Her family brought her inside and called 911. While in the back of the medic unit, the patient became unconscious and unresponsive. The BLS crews provided CPR and with the assistance of King County M-12 paramedics and were able to successfully resuscitate and transport her to Harborview Medical Center. I am pleased to report that she was discharged home awake and alert, and with an opportunity to again enjoy life.

I appreciate your crew's dedication to providing lifesaving care. I recognize that we are constantly working to deliver best care while also evaluating promising approaches or technologies to push cardiac arrest survival even higher here in King County. Such efforts would not be possible without the hard work and commitment of you and your colleagues. [REDACTED] her family and I thank you.

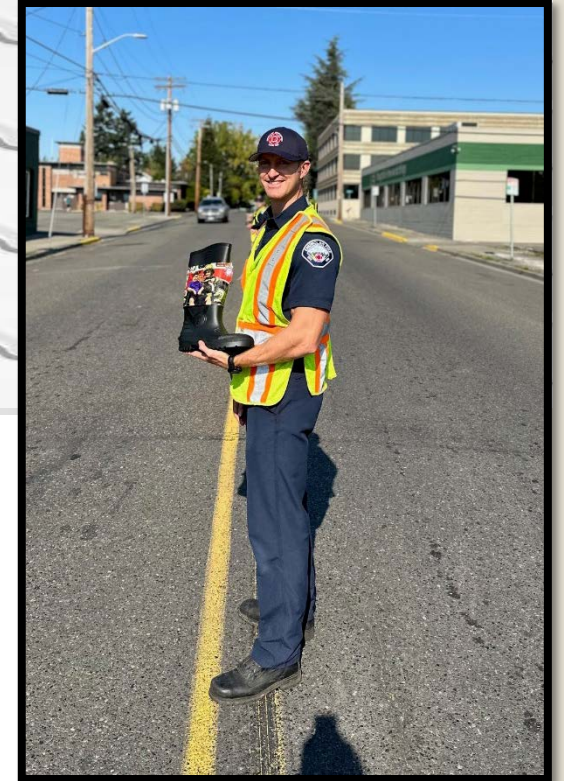
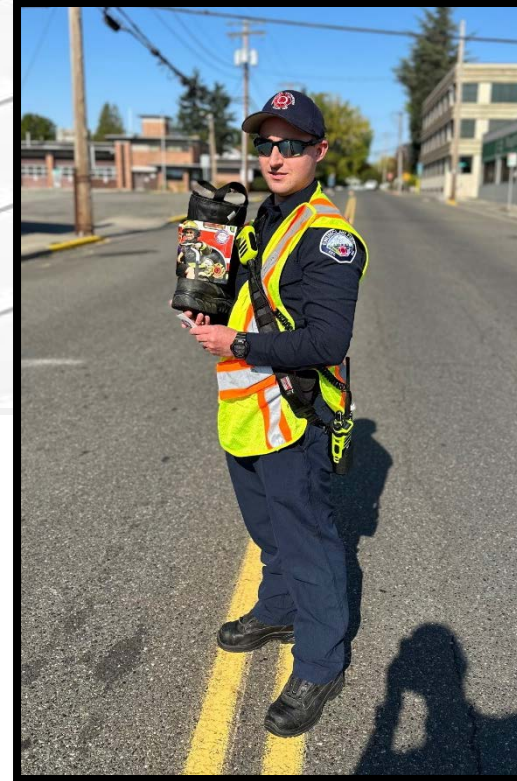
