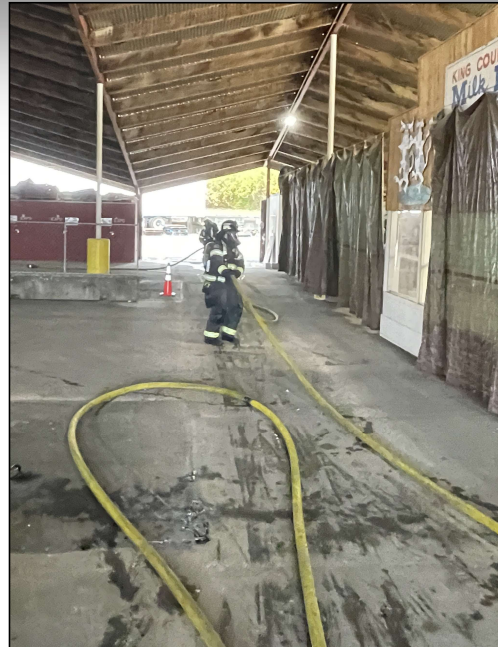

Thank you again for the opportunity. It was an experience I won't soon forget.

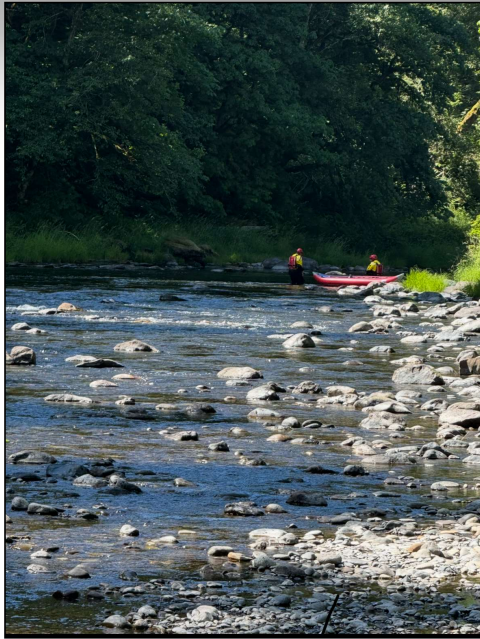

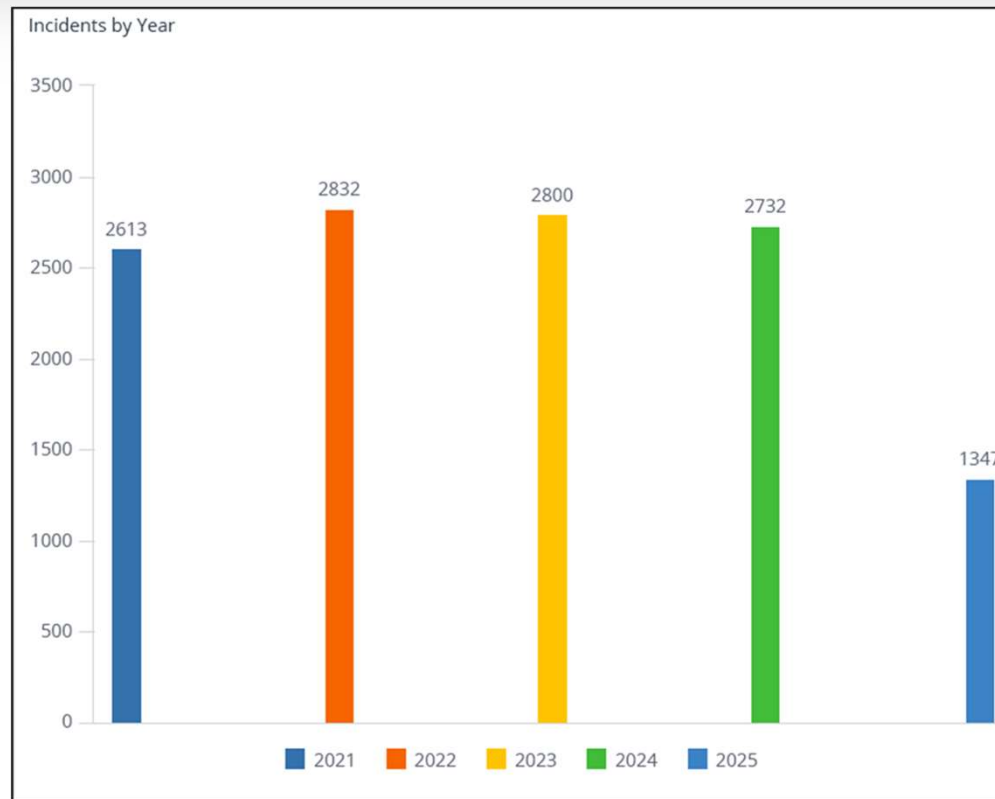

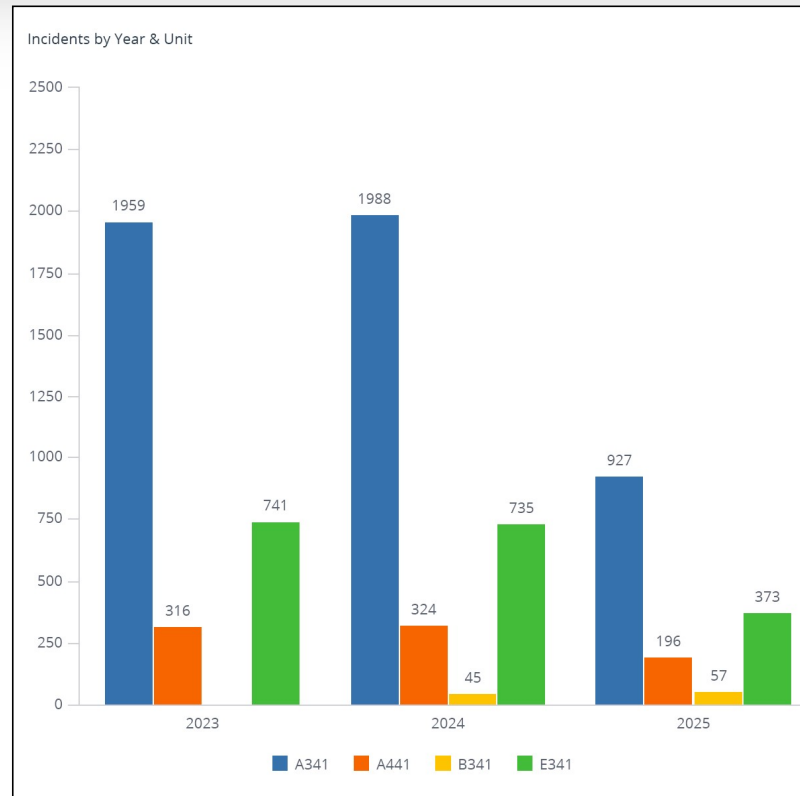


Annual Call Volume Comparison



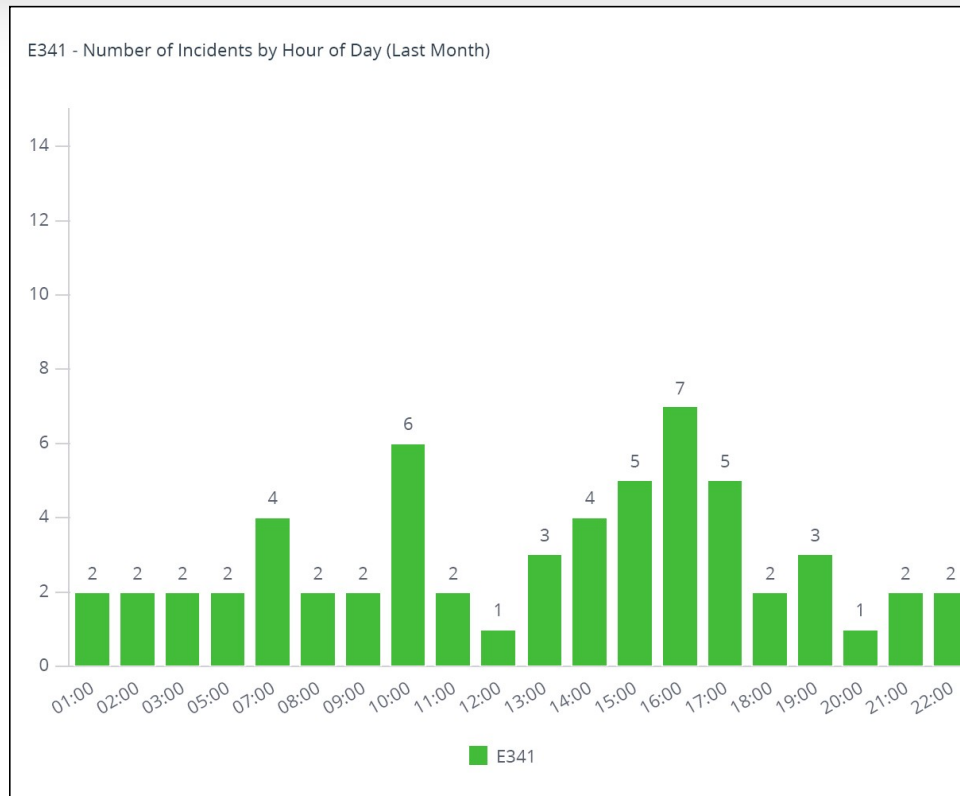


Annual Call Volume Comparison By Unit



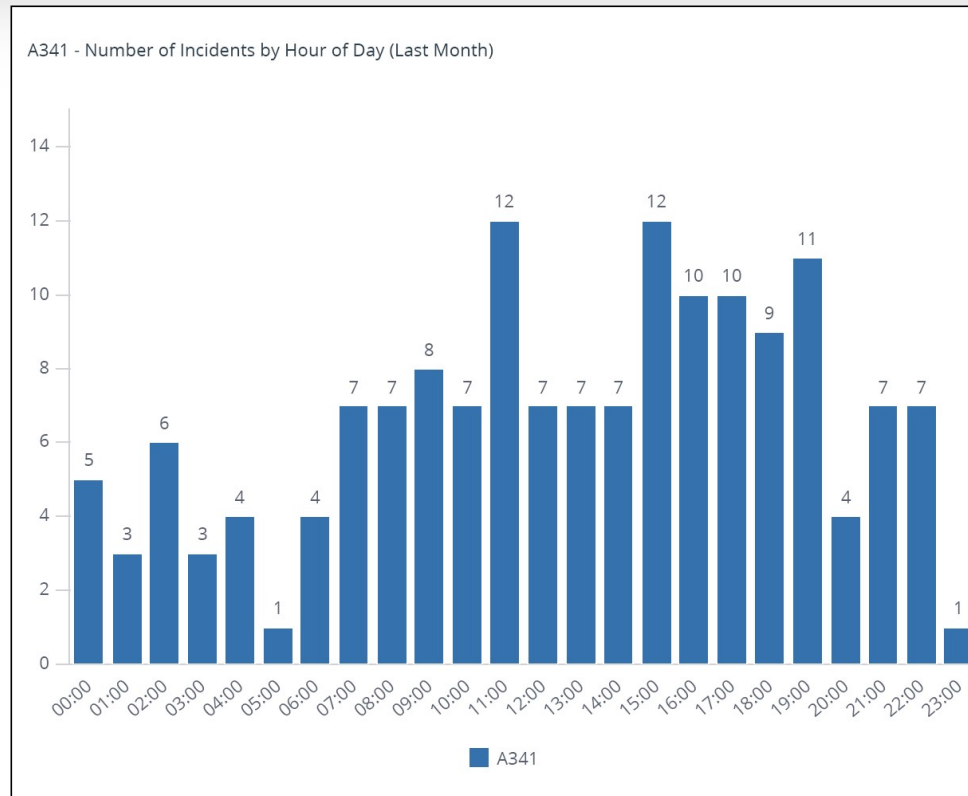


Hourly Call Volume Last Month – E341



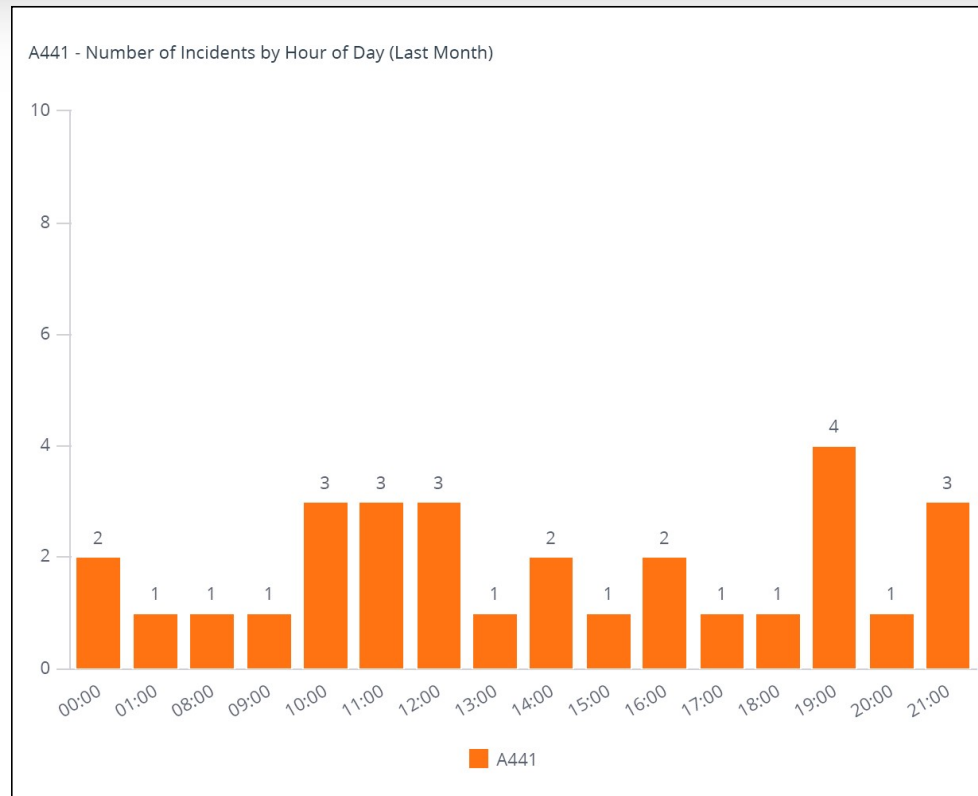


Hourly Call Volume Last Month – A341



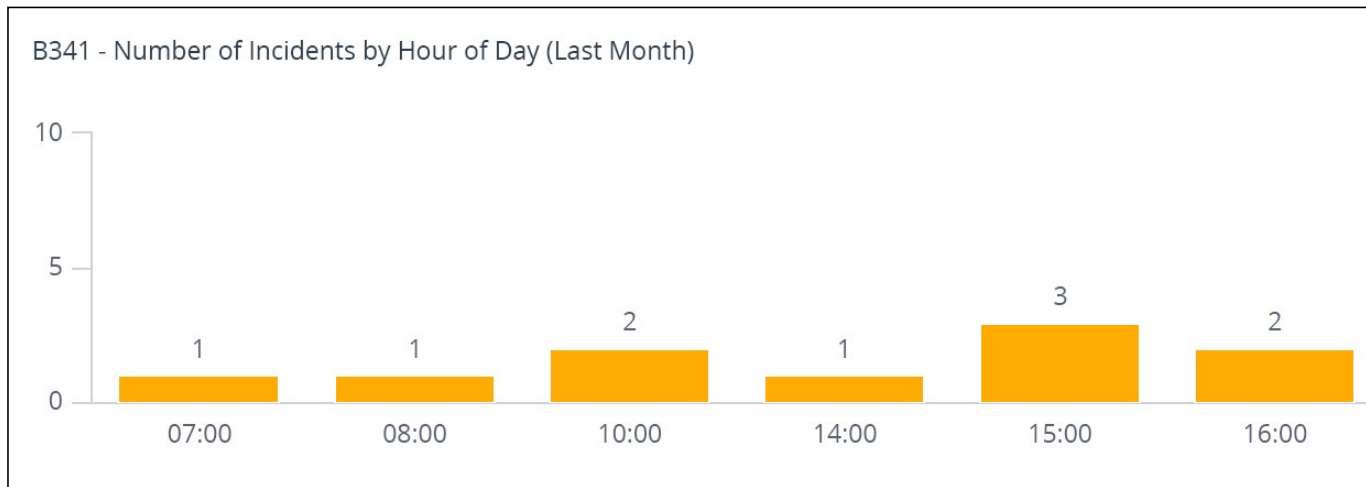


Hourly Call Volume Last Month – A441



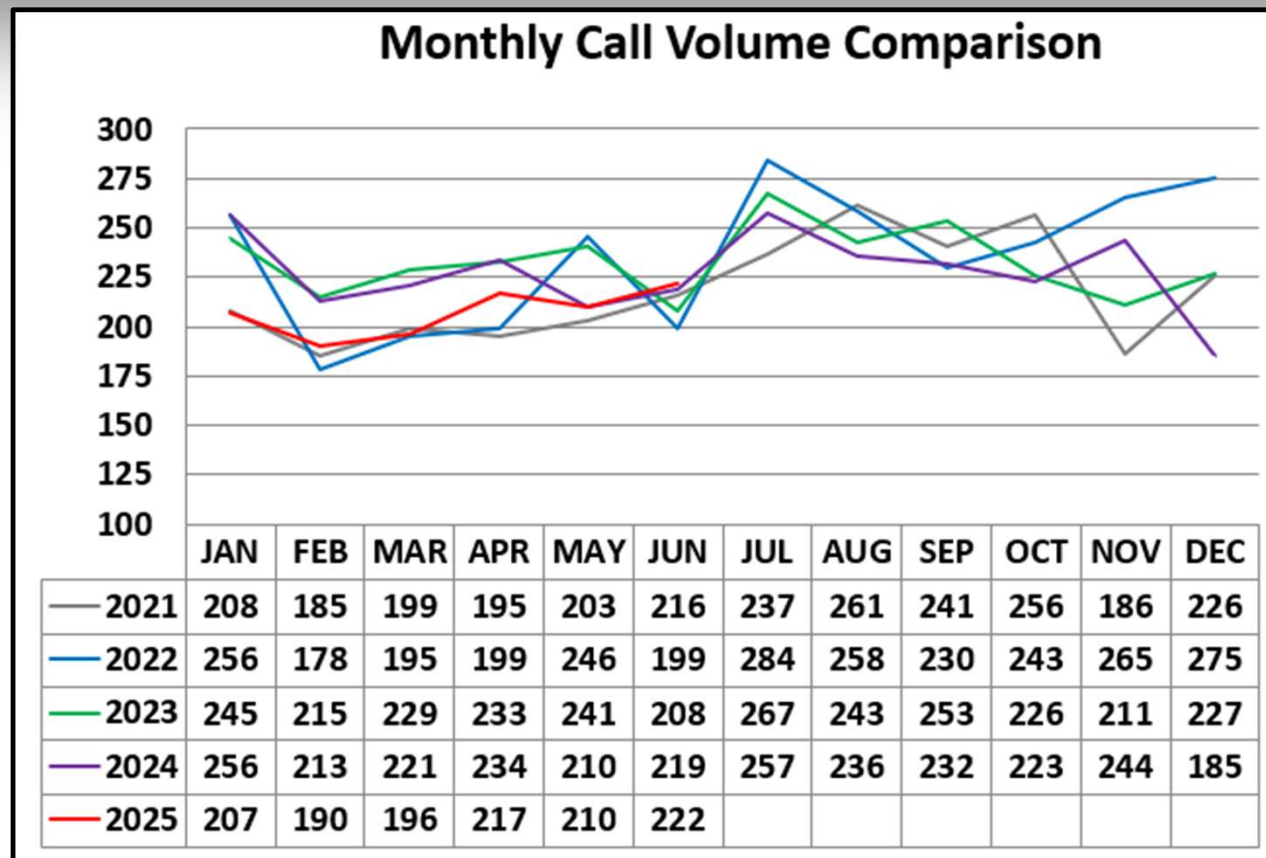


Hourly Call Volume Last Month – B341





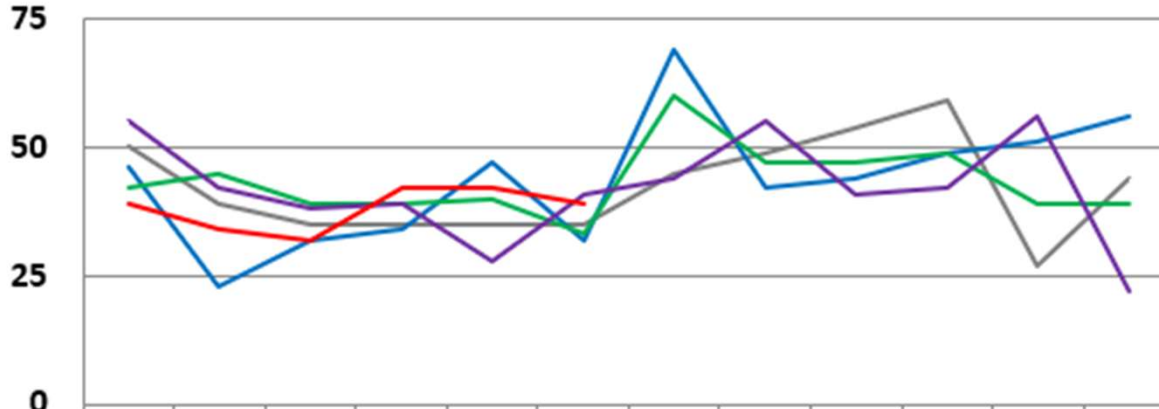
Call Volume Comparison - Monthly

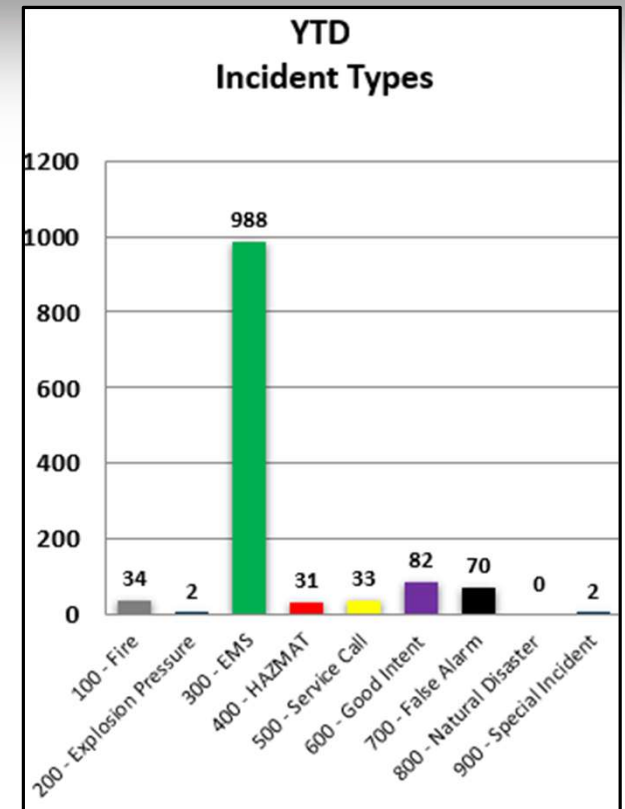
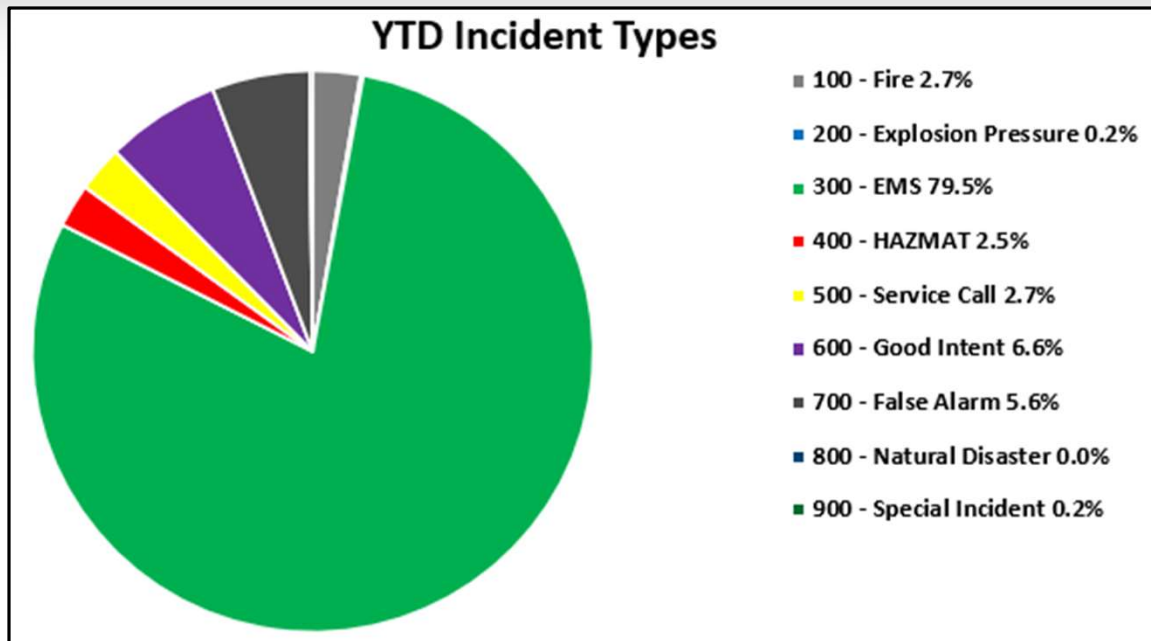

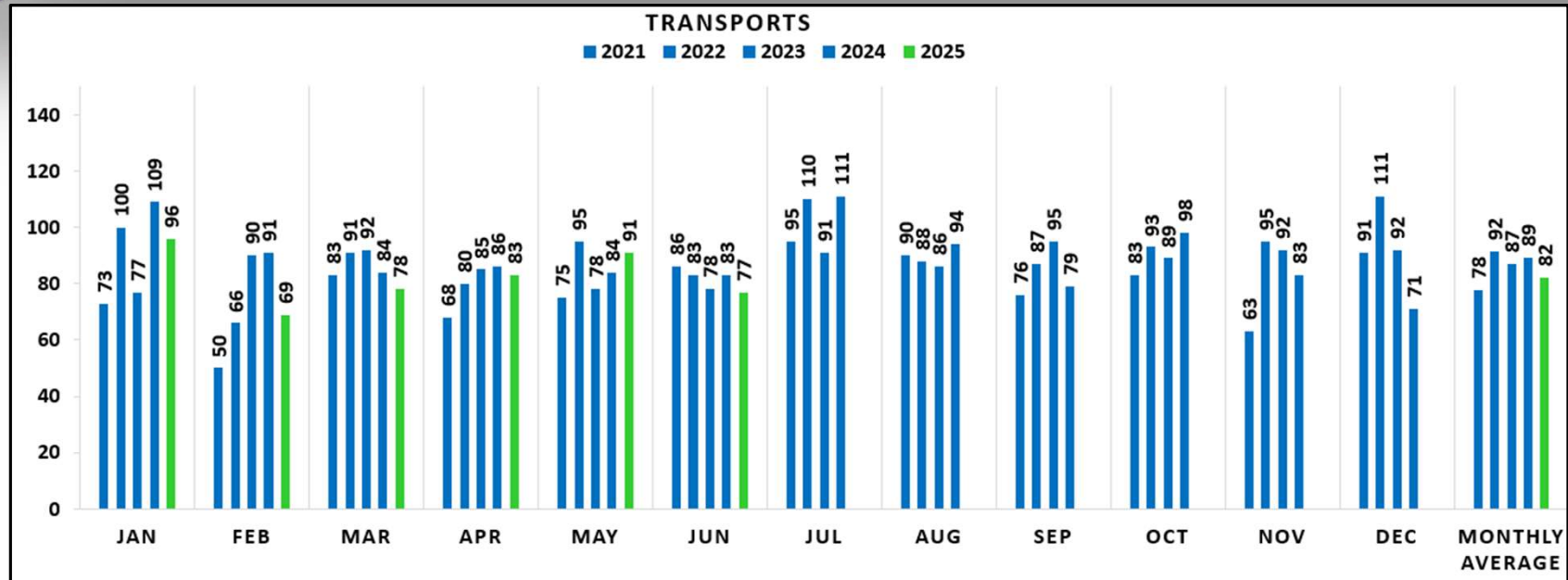


Incidents by Call Type – Year-to-Date

July 4th Information

- Incident Pre-planning
 - Enumclaw Fire upstaffed on July 4th with (7) personnel
 - Units Staffed: B341, E341, A341, A441/BR341
- EFD had 13 Calls for Service
 - 5 Fire-related incidents
 - 4 Likely caused by fireworks
- Historical EFD July 4th call volume (from 7/4 0800 – 7/5 0800):
 - 2022 - 11 Incidents
 - 2023 - 13 Incidents
 - 2024 - 8 Incidents
 - 2025 - 13 Incidents
