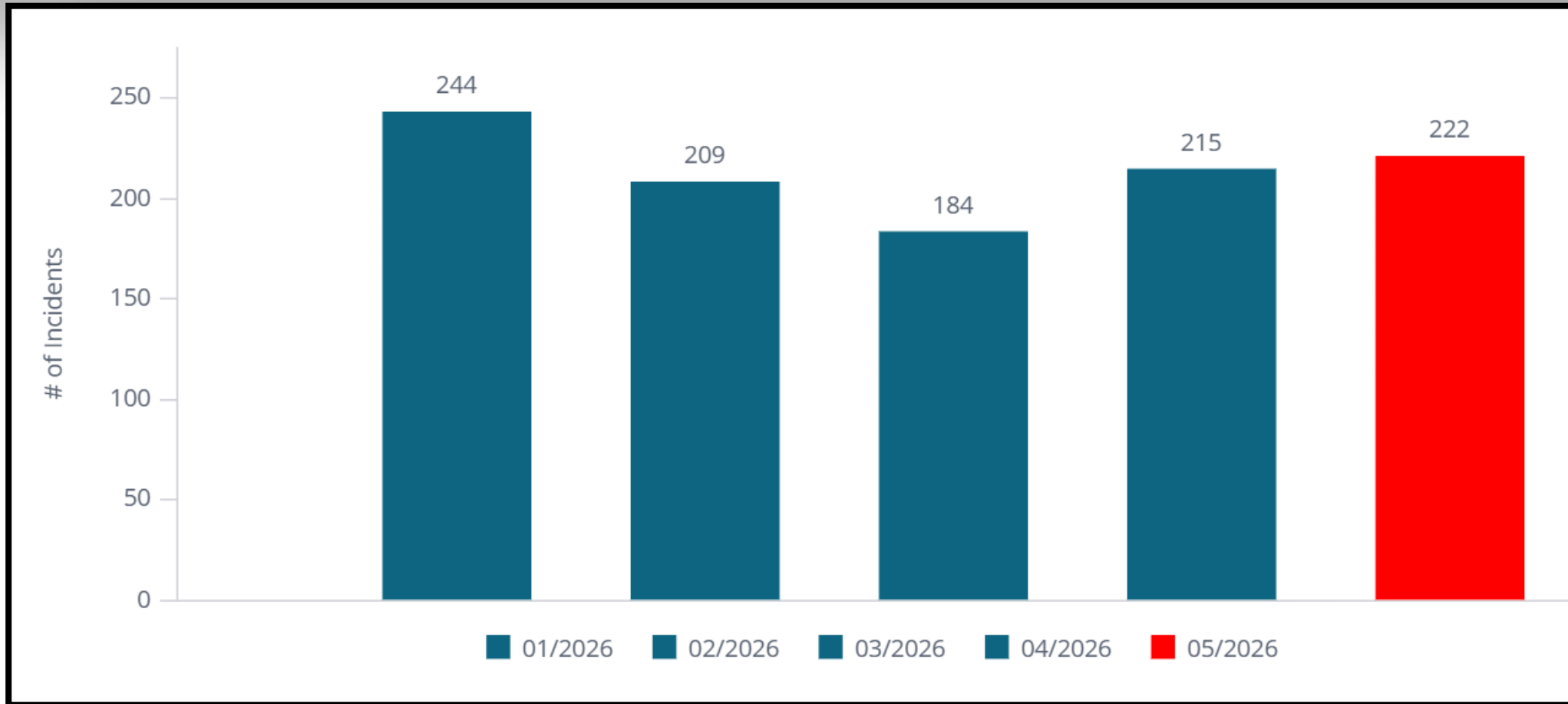

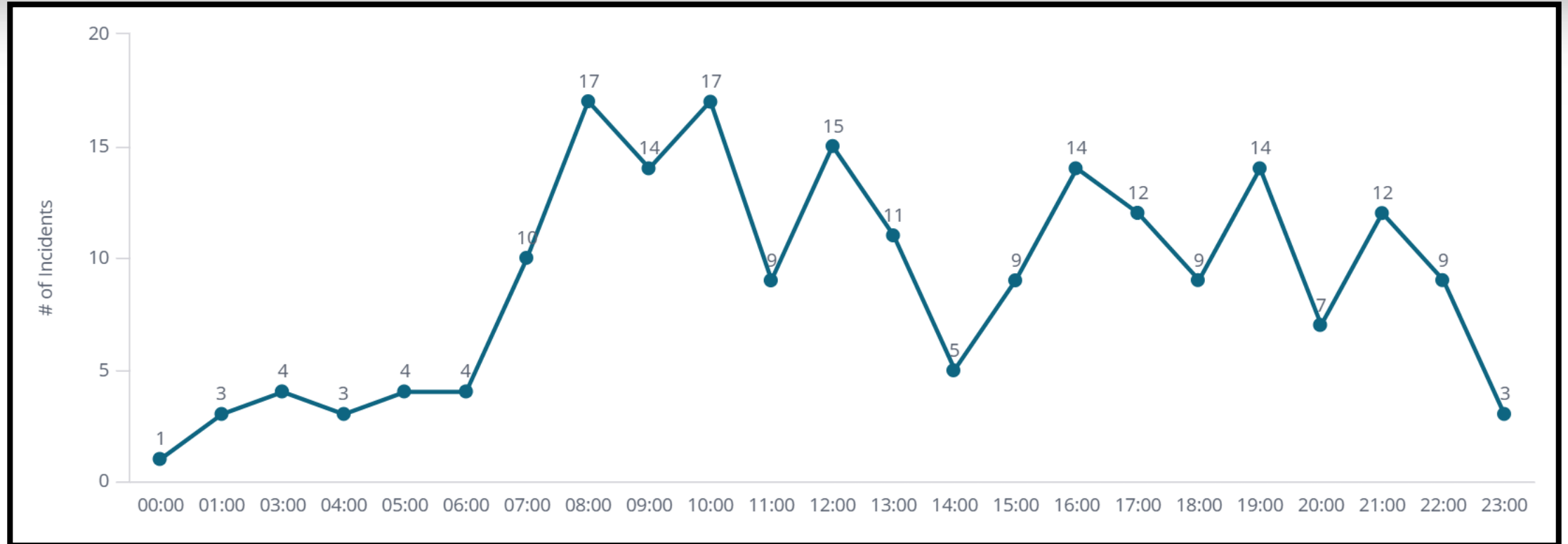

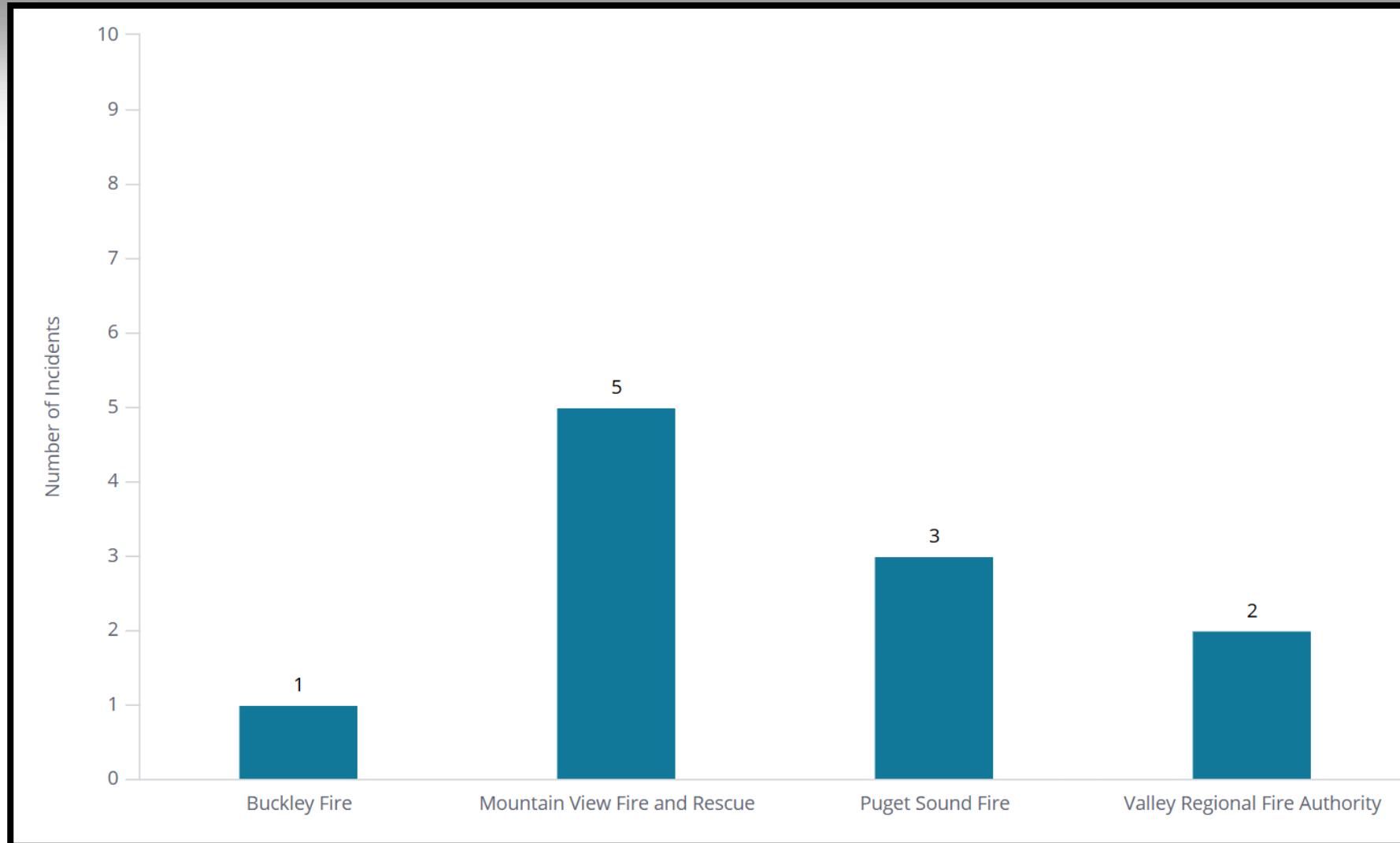


Incidents By Hour – Last Month



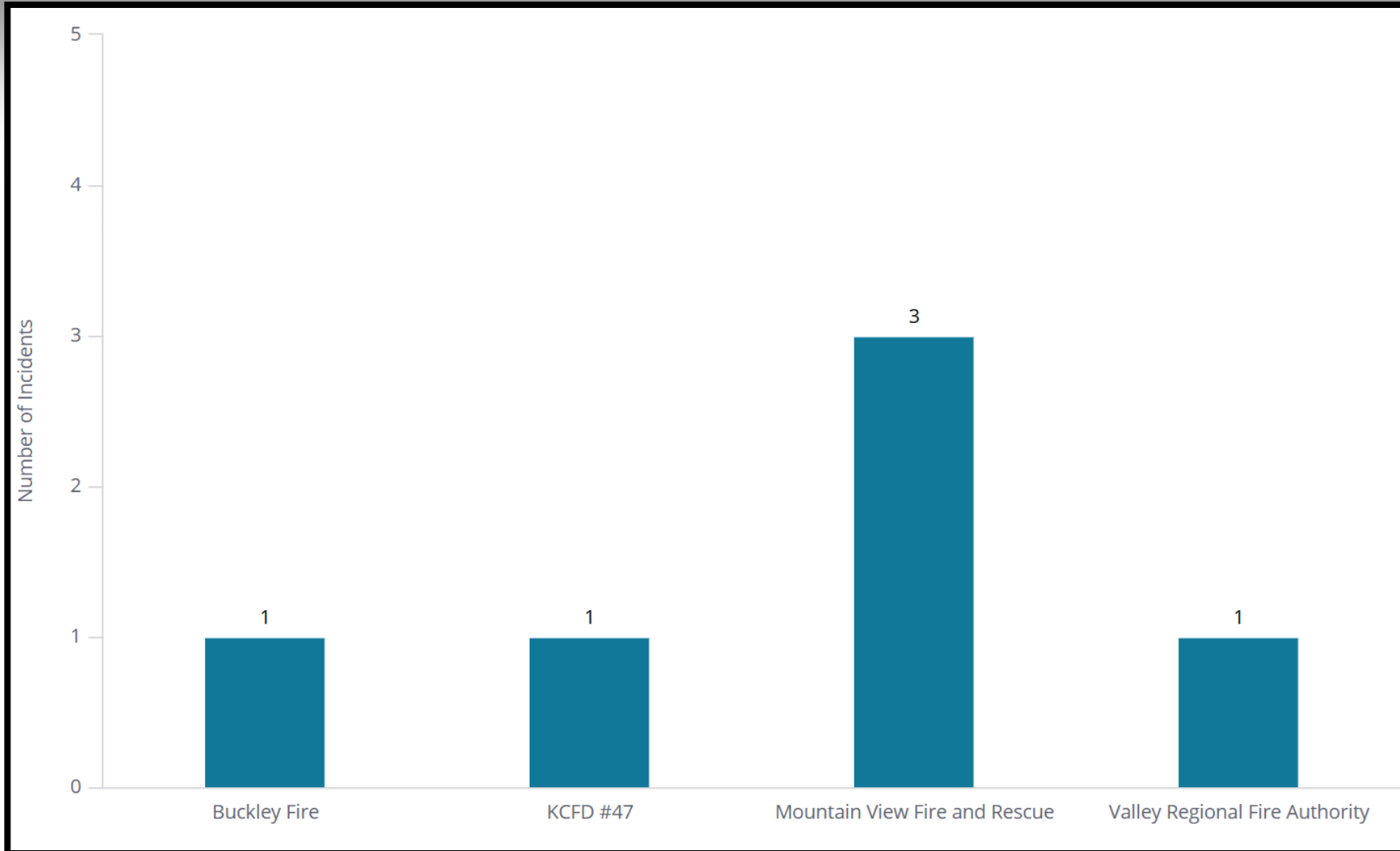


Automatic Aid Received – Last Month





Automatic Aid Given – Last Month



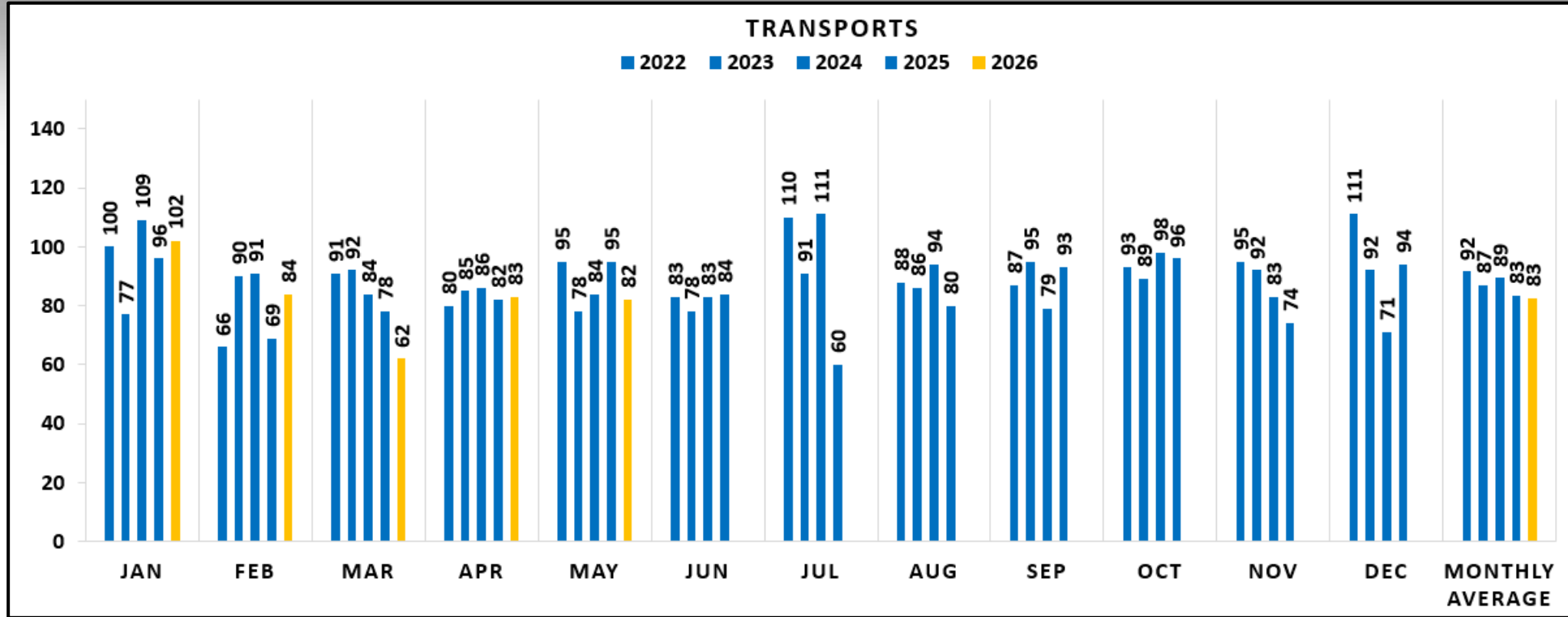


Concurrent Calls – Last Month

- In May, there were 33 instances of simultaneous emergency incidents, resulting in a total of **74** calls occurring concurrently with other calls.
- Of those 33 instances:
 - 26 instances where **2** calls were occurring at the same time
 - 6 instances where **3** calls were occurring at the same time
 - 1 instance where **4** calls were occurring at the same time
- With one staffed station, this highlights the ongoing demand placed both on our department resources and neighboring agencies, and the importance of maintaining sufficient staffing and response capabilities to effectively serve the community when multiple emergencies occur at the same time.
